



Scavenger Hunt

Step 1: Write Four Clues

To start, adults will need to write four clues that hint at the location of a section of music. Each clue should be written with the age and skill level of the children in mind. Once you have your clues, print out the corresponding sections of music and hide them around the designated area.

Step 2: Choose a Difficulty Level

Next, you will need to choose a difficulty level for the scavenger hunt. There are two options available: easy or hard. For the easy scavenger hunt, children will match the music they find to the order on their worksheet. For the hard scavenger hunt, children will copy what they find on the music staff.

Step 3: Complete the Scavenger Hunt

Once the scavenger hunt has been set up, it's time for the children to start searching! Encourage them to work together and have fun while they search for the hidden sections of music. Once they have found all four sections, they can move on to the final step.

Step 4: Listen to Prokofiev's Violin Concerto No. 1

After the children have completed the scavenger hunt, it's time to listen to Prokofiev's Violin Concerto No. 1. If they were careful and copied the clues in order, they will have the melody they will hear at the beginning of the piece. This is a great way to engage children with classical music and encourage them to develop a love for the arts.




If you were careful and copied the clues in order, you'll have the melody at the beginning of Prokofiev's Violin Concerto No. 1.


